Wonderland Festival was founded in 2012 to bridge even the most daring contemporary creations with the perspective of local audiences, particularly supporting emerging artists. Since then, the festival has grown exponentially, but it still maintains as its main goals: the audience as an active producer of meanings; fostering new talents of the performing arts, providing a platform for international exchange and networking. The festival has been supported by the Italian Ministry of Culture since 2016 and it is organized by Idra Teatro, under the artistic direction of *Davide D'Antonio* with the aim of presenting innovative language in the performing arts.

IdraConnect is a platform within the framework of **Wonderland Festival** for the presentation of Italian artists in contemporary performing arts without barriers of genre. It consists of 5 artists/companies each year selected through a long process by more than 30 Italian programmers. The artists will present both a work they consider representative and a work in progress they are working on.

The companies part of IdraConnect 2025 are: La Casa di Argilla, Nadia Addis, Diana Anselmo, Michael Incarbone, Frosini/Timpano.

Starting from 2024 the project 'IdraConnect' is sustained in its communication phases and in the mobility of Italian artists in foreign countries, by the Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation - General Management for Public and Cultural Diplomacy.

For international programmers who are interested in participating and submit their interest we can provide reimbursement of flight tickets up to 200 eu, upon presentation of receipts, lodging and free entrance to every Italian performance. Places with these conditions are limited.

LACASADARGILLA

lacasadargilla brings together Lisa Ferlazzo Natoli – author and director – Alessandro Ferroni – director and sound designer – Alice Palazzi – actress and project coordinator – and Maddalena Parise – researcher and visual artist – along with a mobile group of actors, musicians, playwrights, and visual artists.

Lisa Ferlazzo Natoli curates the artistic direction of various projects, including Ascesa e rovina della città di Mahagonny by Brecht for the Napoli Theatre Festival, Wake up! Bagliori della primavera araba for the Teatro di Roma, and IF/Invasioni (dal) Futuro for the Estate Romana. She is co-author and performer of Les Adieux! Parole salvate dalle fiamme for the RomaEuropa Festival. She directs Lear by Edward Bond for the Teatro di Roma, the radio drama The Testament of This Day also by Bond, and Distant Lights from Dark Places by Andrew Bovell for Radio3 Rai. In 2019, she won the UBU Award for Best Director for When the Rain Stops Falling by Bovell, as well as the Best Director award from the National Association of Theater Critics.

Since 2021, lacasadargilla has been an associated artist of the Piccolo Teatro di Milano-Teatro d'Europa. lacasadargilla is also part of the European project STAGES Sustainable Theatre Alliance for a Green Environmental Shift for the Piccolo Teatro di Milano-Teatro d'Europa in 2023.

MICHAEL INCARBONE

Michael Incarbone (1995) is a multidisciplinary artist, dancer, performer, and author. He trained in the contemporary dance department at the National Academy of Dance. As a dancer, he has collaborated with Georgia Tegou and Michaelis Theophanous (UK), Compagnia Virgilio Sieni, DNA Dance Company, and Giuseppe Muscarello.

Currently, he is a performer for ALDES - Roberto Castello, Kinkaleri, Adriana Borriello Dance Research, Giselda Ranieri, and the artistic collective Polisonum. He is also an associated artist at PinDoc, a dance production organization.

His dance video GO ASK ALICE won the Premio Roma Danza 2020. His works are hosted at national and European festivals. He is one of the artists selected for the Nouveau Grand Tour, a residency project between France and Italy supported by the MIC and the Italian Institute of Culture in Paris. He won the "Per chi Crea – SIAE" award with the new production fin che ci trema il cuore, supported by ALDES, Anghiari Dance Hub, ATCL, Orbita|Spellbound National Dance Production Centre, Teatri di Vetro / Triangolo Scaleno, and Hangartfest in collaboration with the National Interest Centre for Dance Scenario Pubblico/CZD.

DIANA ANSELMO

Diana Anselmo (1997) is a performer and Deaf author, activist, and improvisational human being. Bilingual in LIS (Italian Sign Language) and Italian, she made her debut during her Master's in Theatre and Performing Arts with her first performance, *Autoritratto in 3 atti* (2021), which is still presented at various festivals in Italy and abroad (DIS_Festival - Serbia, ORME Festival - Switzerland, Culturgest - Portugal).

Abroad, she debuted in Berlin, performing with renowned artists such as Xavier Le Roy in Le Sacre du Printemps (2022). She is one of the founders of Al.Di.Qua. Artists, the first European association for and by artists with disabilities, and has participated as a speaker in various European festivals (IntegrART - Switzerland, DansFunk - Sweden, Holland Dance Festival - Netherlands). She is the accessibility manager for the Oriente Occidente Festival and Spazio Kor, with a specific focus on the Deaf community. Among other roles, she is the youngest member of the Cultural Advisory Board of the British Council.

NADIA ADDIS

Nadia Addis (1990) began her artistic training at the age of 15, studying hip hop and street dance. After graduating from the Artistic High School, she continued her education at the Academy of Fine Arts in Sassari, in the department of painting decoration.

In 2014, she trained in Bologna at the International School of Physical Theatre. In 2017, she graduated from the CAU Circus and Theatre School in Granada. At the same time, she became involved in the world of masks and figure theatre. She trained alongside Pierre Byland, I Lizarazou, Antony Mathieu, Stefano Mazzota, and Roberto Magro.

She has worked with Cie Theatre Crac (Collectif la basse cour) and is a circus performer in the concerts of Vinicio Capossela, as well as a tightrope walker for Circo Soluna. She collaborates with the company Nando & Maila, which produced her show *Brigitte et le petit bal perdu*, which received a Special Mention at the Premio Scenario Infanzia 2019. She is a selected artist for the special projects funded by the Ministry of Culture, *La donna Cannone*, and BoardingPass *La donna Cannone international*.

Elvira Frosini and Daniele Timpano are authors, directors, and actors of the contemporary Italian stage who have shared a common artistic journey since 2008. Their works have been performed and co-produced by the most important theaters and festivals in Italy and abroad, including Romaeuropa Festival, Teatro Argentina in Rome, Teatro Metastasio in Prato, Piccolo Teatro in Milan, Teatro Elfo Puccini in Milan, Bassano Opera Estate, Ferrara International Festival, Mantua Literature Festival, Teatro Ponchielli in Cremona, Inequilibrio Festival in Castiglioncello (Li), Teatro della Tosse, Festival delle Colline Torinesi, Teatro Bellini in Naples, Teatro Biondo in Palermo, Short Theatre Festival in Rome, "Face a Face" / Theatre de la Ville Paris, La Nuit Blanche in Paris.
